Statement on Holy Communion/The Lord's Supper

The Lord's Supper is celebrated at this congregation in the confession and glad confidence that, as He says, our Lord gives into our mouths not only bread and wine but his very body and blood to eat and to drink for the forgiveness of sins and to strengthen our union with Him and with one another. Our Lord invites to His table those who trust His words, repent of all sin, and set aside any refusal to forgive and love as He forgives and loves us, that they may show forth His death until He comes.

Because those who eat and drink our Lord's body and blood unworthily do so to their great harm and because Holy Communion is a confession of the faith which is confessed at this altar, any who are not yet instructed, in doubt, or who hold a confession differing from that of this congregation and The Lutheran Church— Missouri Synod, and yet desire to receive the sacrament, are asked first to speak with the pastor or an usher.

For further study, see Matthew 5:23f.; 10:32f.; 18:15-35; 26:26-29; 1 Cor. 11:1734. Faith in Christ and His word is necessary for a blessed reception including Baptism in the name of the Trinity and faith in [1] Christ as Savior, [2] Jesus' clear words that the Sacrament is His body and blood, [3] the Lord's promise that in the Sacrament his or her sins are forgiven, and [4] receipt of the promised forgiveness reaffirmed and strengthened in his or her union with Christ and other Christians. The unbaptized and uninstructed person who does not yet know or believe in Christ and His promises is unprepared and should not commune. The unrepentant person who does not seek Christ's forgiveness for sins—either general or particular—or refuses to forgive someone is unprepared and should not commune. The doubting person who denies or is unconvinced of what Jesus says of His bodily presence in the sacrament or its promised forgiveness is unprepared and should not commune.

Prayer Before Communion

Dear Savior, at Your gracious invitation I come to Your table to eat and drink Your holy body and blood. Let me find favor in Your eyes to receive this holy Sacrament in faith for the salvation of my soul and to the glory of Your holy name; for You live and reign with the Father and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.

Prayer After Communion

Almighty and everlasting God, I thank and praise You for feeding me the life-giving body and blood of Your beloved Son, Jesus Christ. Send Your Holy Spirit that, having with my mouth received the holy Sacrament, I may by faith obtain and eternally enjoy Your divine grace, the forgiveness of sins, unity with Christ, and life eternal; through Jesus Christ, my Lord. Amen.



Who Is a Cheerful Giver?

LCMS Stewardship Ministry Resources

St. Paul wrote to the Church of Christ in Corinth: "Each one must give as he has decided in his heart, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver" (2 Cor 9:7). *God loves a cheerful giver*. But who is a cheerful giver?

Abel was. By faith, Abel gave the firstborn of his flock, and it was acceptable in God's sight. Abraham was. By faith, Abraham prepared cakes and a tender choice calf for God and entertained angels unaware. So also were David and Solomon. By faith, David would not make a sacrifice to God that cost him nothing, so he paid Araunah his due. By faith, Solomon built a house for God, where his name would dwell and thereby where He would dwell to be Israel's God and they His people.




What more shall I say? For time would fail me to tell of all those who gave not simply for the joy of giving but for the joy of knowing the One to whom they gave.

So also our Lord, who for the joy set before Him, gave everything, yes, even His life, enduring the cross and scorning its shame. He gave to the shedding of His blood, willingly and resolutely setting His face toward Jerusalem to die for the life of the world. Though He was rich in every way, He became poor, so that by His poverty we might be rich beyond measure.

So then, let us – like Abel and Abraham, like David and Solomon, and even like our Lord Jesus Christ – give cheerfully to God for the work of His kingdom in our midst. Like them, let us decide in our heart – for the joy set before us – the joy of knowing the One to whom we give is the One who gives us all good things.





Help For Your Food Budget

SHARE, a non-profit, community-based organization, provides healthy and nutritious groceries at an almost 50% discount. This is ac-



complished through high-volume purchasing and thousands of volunteer hours.

Monthly packages cost \$23 and include \$40-\$50 worth of basic and healthy groceries, typically made up of 4-6 lbs of frozen protein and 8-12 lbs fresh fruits and vegetables, sometimes with seasonal grocery or dessert items. "Specials" are also available each month.

Organ Fund Update

Since the total in the Organ Fund exceeds the goal amount for the Rodgers Inspire 233 organ (\$43,900) by quite a significant amount (\$6,000),



we will continue to raise funds in the hopes of obtaining the Rodgers Inspire 343 organ for the amount of \$64,700, as presented by Marty back in September.

As per the existing contract we have six months to raise the difference and purchase the Rodgers Inspired 343 organ for only the additional cost (no additional shipping or installation charges) in place of the one now on contract. We have been approached by several members who hope to continue to raise money for the Inspire 343. The additional amount needed is \$12,400. these members would like to request that the congregation also consider donating to help raise the additional monies needed.

hope that is in us (1 Pet. 3:15): the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ, delivered to His people in Word and Sacrament for the forgiveness of sins, life and salvation. We do not cry simply because we miss our loved ones. We cry also for joy knowing:

- We will see them again
- They are in the presence of Christ at peace
- We are already united with them in Christ and the Sacrament of the Altar
- They pray for us


It is custom to observe a *Totenfest* on All Saints Day. A *Totenfest* ("celebration of the dead") is a German Church tradition of remembering those who have died in the faith. Our worship practices on All Saints Day include:

Special prayers: I heard a voice from heaven saying, 'Write: Blessed are the dead who die in the Lord henceforth.' 'Blessed indeed,' says the Spirit, 'that they may rest from their labors, for their deeds follow them.'" Let us remember with thanksgiving those who have gone before us with the sign of faith, for they were redeemed by God. He gave them new life through His Son in Holy Baptism. He nourished them in the company of His people at His holy table. In His mercy and wisdom, He summoned them to His nearer presence so that they may rest in His blissful peace forever.

We light candles, read names, and toll bells for those who received the ministry of the church during their last days and received a Christian burial in the past year.

We pause for all to name in their hearts their loved ones who have fallen asleep in Christ Jesus. Then the bell is tolled three times

The Pastor prays: In joyful expectation of the resurrection to life, we remember before You, O Lord, all our departed kin and friends who have gone before us in the faith. We offer thanksgiv-



ing for the gift of faith and hold fast to the certainty of Your promises. We implore You, remember Your Church throughout the world; make all its members grow in love for You and for one another. As You have received our brothers and sisters who have gone to their rest in the hope of the resurrection to eternal life, bring us at the last with them into the light of Your presence, that in union with all Your saints we may give You glory forever, through Your Son, Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

There is more weeping at All Saints Day than almost any other time of year, and yet the festival is dearly loved. The prayers, the names, and the ringing of the bells, and the hymns, are powerful reminders of the promises of God making weeping most appropriate.

The Church Triumphant contains many great and famous men and women who lived extraordinary lives and died with honor rather than deny Christ, but the Church Triumphant is also filled with quiet saints – also known, loved and missed by us. The fact that they matter to us also matters to God and the saints. Thus we rejoice while we weep because every tear is removed from the eyes of the saints. We also weep in joy because we are eager for the day when every tear is removed from our eyes.

All Saints Day: Interlude and Vision of Comfort [Revelation 7: 1-17]

Saint John takes an interlude to introduce the church

- The sealed 144,000 are the church militant
- The great crowd in heaven that no one can number church triumphant

FIRST MESSAGE - MERCY: Four angels stand astride the whole earth holding back the four winds

SECOND MESSAGE - GRACE: A fifth angel comes from the rising of the sun with the seal of the living God

- In 2 Timothy 2:19 Paul says the firm foundation of God stands bearing this seal; the Lord knows who are his.
- We are sealed by the Holy Spirit as the pledge and guarantee of our inheritance
 The 144,000: Twelve Tribes of Israel or the whole church on earth?
- John uses Old Testament language the twelve tribes to describe the

144,000 – symbolic or literal number?

John is consistent with tradition in describing the 144,000 as a symbolic number

What about the identity of the twelve tribes – symbolic or literal?

The twelve tribes are redefined to recognize a faithful lineage of Christ

The countless saints in heaven are at rest and peace

 Romans 8: 18 has come true – the sufferings of this present time cannot be compared to the glory that shall be revealed to us

<u>The saints all belong to the angel's choir and sing hymns of praise - Te Deum</u> [tē 'dēem]

What a choir – what lyrics – what content!

The saints in heaven are alive and well celebrating the presence of our living Lord

Berthold Von Schenk – a Lutheran pastor on the saints and Holy Communion

The altar is the trysting place where we meet our beloved Lord. It is also the trysting place where we meet our loved ones – for they are with the Lord. The nearer I come to my Lord in Holy Communion, the nearer I come to the Saints – to my own loved ones.

How appropriate to place flowers on the altar in memory of the saints!

No worry; the saints live in eternal communion with God and family

- As we commune at the table of the Lamb and sing His praise, we join the saints
- Rest today knowing the saints pray for us they are waiting for us and I believe
 they know who is coming next
