resource for individuals and families. We hope this will be a valuable tool for you as we prepare for Stewardship Sunday on November 17.

### Statement on Holy Communion/The Lord's Supper

The Lord's Supper is celebrated at this congregation in the confession and glad confidence that, as He says, our Lord gives into our mouths not only bread and wine but his very body and blood to eat and to drink for the forgiveness of sins and to strengthen our union with Him and with one another. Our Lord invites to His table those who trust His words, repent of all sin, and set aside any refusal to forgive and love as He forgives and loves us, that they may show forth His death until He comes.

Because those who eat and drink our Lord's body and blood unworthily do so to their great harm and because Holy Communion is a confession of the faith which is confessed at this altar, any who are not yet instructed, in doubt, or who hold a confession differing from that of this congregation and The Lutheran Church— Missouri Synod, and yet desire to receive the sacrament, are asked first to speak with the pastor or an usher.

For further study, see Matthew 5:23f.; 10:32f.; 18:15-35; 26:26-29; 1 Cor. 11:1734. Faith in Christ and His word is necessary for a blessed reception including Baptism in the name of the Trinity and faith in [1] Christ as Savior, [2] Jesus' clear words that the Sacrament is His body and blood, [3] the Lord's promise that in the Sacrament his or her sins are forgiven, and [4] receipt of the promised forgiveness reaffirmed and strengthened in his or her union with Christ and other Christians. The unbaptized and uninstructed person who does not yet know or believe in Christ and His promises is unprepared and should not commune. The unrepentant person who does not seek Christ's forgiveness for sins—either general or particular—or refuses to forgive someone is unprepared and should not commune. The doubting person who denies or is unconvinced of what Jesus says of His bodily presence in the sacrament or its promised forgiveness is unprepared and should not commune.

### **Prayer Before Communion**

Dear Savior, at Your gracious invitation I come to Your table to eat and drink Your holy body and blood. Let me find favor in Your eyes to receive this holy Sacrament in faith for the salvation of my soul and to the glory of Your holy name; for You live and reign with the Father and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.

### **Prayer After Communion**

Almighty and everlasting God, I thank and praise You for feeding me the life-giving body and blood of Your beloved Son, Jesus Christ. Send Your Holy Spirit that, having with my mouth received the holy Sacrament, I may by faith obtain and eternally enjoy Your divine grace, the forgiveness of sins, unity with Christ, and life eternal; through Jesus Christ, my Lord. Amen.



### **Help For Your Food Budget**

SHARE, a non-profit, community-based organization, provides healthy and nutritious groceries at an almost 50% discount. This is ac-



complished through high-volume purchasing and thousands of volunteer hours.

Monthly packages cost \$23 and include \$40-\$50 worth of basic and healthy groceries, typically made up of 4-6 lbs of frozen protein and 8-12 lbs fresh fruits and vegetables, sometimes with seasonal grocery or dessert items. "Specials" are also available each month.

### **Organ Fund Update**

Since the total in the Organ Fund exceeds the goal amount for the Rodgers Inspire 233 organ (\$43,900) by quite a significant amount, we




will continue to raise funds in the hopes of obtaining the Rodgers Inspire 343 organ for the amount of \$64,700, as presented by Marty back in September.

As per the existing contract we have six months to raise the difference and purchase the Rodgers Inspired 343 organ for only the additional cost (no additional shipping or installation charges) in place of the one now on contract. We have been approached by several members who hope to continue to raise money for the Inspire 343. Funds raised to date—\$52,800. Additional amount needed—\$11,900. These members would like to request that the congregation also consider donating to help raise the additional monies needed.



Elite Sadducees – One Bride for Seven Brothers [Luke 20: 27-40]

- Elite late sociologist C. Wright Mills
- 2. The scribes and Pharisees and Sadducees are the functional and structural elite who compete with Jesus
- 3. We meet the aristocratic elite of Jerusalem the Sadducees for the first time in Luke 20
- 4. The Pharisees and scribes are the right-wing, conservative Bible thumpers of the day always eager to point out whenever someone else breaks their rules!
- 5. The controversy in our text starts with the Sadducees but ends with the scribes.
- The topic of resurrection introduces a sub-plot between the competing Sadducees and Pharisees
- 7. Let the debate begin: the Sadducees attempt to trap Jesus over the question of levirate marriage in the resurrection a resurrection they do not believe in
- 8. The Sadducees are wrong at the outset by equating marriage in this age with the age to come
- Jesus presents the doctrine of resurrection from the canon of the Sadducees Exodus 3
- 10. The reaction of the scribes is partisan acknowledging Jesus as a great teacher
  - It is not an acknowledgement of faith
- 11. The Sadducees, Pharisees, and scribes are wired with the central contradiction of the power elite
  - They violate the very laws they are sworn to uphold Roman, Jewish, and God's
- 12. Jesus remains a figure of controversy and rejection to this day because he occupies social space against the elite.
- 13. The great difference between doctrine and life is obvious, even as the difference between heaven and earth.
  - Life may be unclean, sinful, and inconsistent; but doctrine must be pure, holy, sound, unchanging ... not a jot, tittle, or letter may be omitted from God's truth
  - The identity of Jesus the law of God the atonement and resurrection are not controversies they are historical fact and foundational matters of faith
  - [John 11] I am the resurrection and the life. Whoever believes in me, though he die, yet shall he live, and everyone who lives and believes in me shall never die.
