## **Call Committee Update**

November 17th, 2019

In early November, the Southeast District (SED) President provided GLCS with a list of pastors for consideration as our next senior pastor. Our new Circuit Visitor (Pastor Ogne from Lutheran Church of Our Savior in Bryans Road) called the pastors on the list and asked if they were in a position to consider a call from GLCS. (Note: the pastors on the list did not know their names had been provided to GLCS until Pastor Ogne talked with them. Also, a pastor indicating he can consider a call does not mean he would accept a call if one were extended).

While a few of the pastors said they were not in a position to consider a call, there were several pastors open to considering a call. The SED President, Pastor Ogne and the call committee believe we are in a position to move forward with the list provided. Over the next several weeks, the call committee will be reviewing backgrounds of the pastors open to considering a call. As was done with the first

## Statement on Holy Communion/The Lord's Supper

The Lord's Supper is celebrated at this congregation in the confession and glad confidence that, as He says, our Lord gives into our mouths not only bread and wine but his very body and blood to eat and to drink for the forgiveness of sins and to strengthen our union with Him and with one another. Our Lord invites to His table those who trust His words, repent of all sin, and set aside any refusal to forgive and love as He forgives and loves us, that they may show forth His death until He comes.

Because those who eat and drink our Lord's body and blood unworthily do so to their great harm and because Holy Communion is a confession of the faith which is confessed at this altar, any who are not yet instructed, in doubt, or who hold a confession differing from that of this congregation and The Lutheran Church— Missouri Synod, and yet desire to receive the sacrament, are asked first to speak with the pastor or an usher.

For further study, see Matthew 5:23f.; 10:32f.; 18:15-35; 26:26-29; 1 Cor. 11:1734. Faith in Christ and His word is necessary for a blessed reception including Baptism in the name of the Trinity and faith in [1] Christ as Savior, [2] Jesus' clear words that the Sacrament is His body and blood, [3] the Lord's promise that in the Sacrament his or her sins are forgiven, and [4] receipt of the promised forgiveness reaffirmed and strengthened in his or her union with Christ and other Christians. The unbaptized and uninstructed person who does not yet know or believe in Christ and His promises is unprepared and should not commune. The unrepentant person who does not seek Christ's forgiveness for sins—either general or particular—or refuses to forgive someone is unprepared and should not commune. The doubting person who denies or is unconvinced of what Jesus says of His bodily presence in the sacrament or its promised forgiveness is unprepared and should not commune.

#### **Prayer Before Communion**

Dear Savior, at Your gracious invitation I come to Your table to eat and drink Your holy body and blood. Let me find favor in Your eyes to receive this holy Sacrament in faith for the salvation of my soul and to the glory of Your holy name; for You live and reign with the Father and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.

#### **Prayer After Communion**

Almighty and everlasting God, I thank and praise You for feeding me the life-giving body and blood of Your beloved Son, Jesus Christ. Send Your Holy Spirit that, having with my mouth received the holy Sacrament, I may by faith obtain and eternally enjoy Your divine grace, the forgiveness of sins, unity with Christ, and life eternal; through Jesus Christ, my Lord. Amen.





# **Organ Fund Update**

Since the total in the Organ Fund exceeds the goal amount for the Rodgers Inspire 233 or-



gan (\$43,900) by quite a significant amount, we will continue to raise funds in the hopes of obtaining the Rodgers Inspire 343 organ for the amount of \$64,700, as presented by Marty back in September.

As per the existing contract we have six months to raise the difference and purchase the Rodgers Inspired 343 organ for only the additional cost (no additional shipping or installation charges) in place of the one now on contract. We have been approached by several members who hope to continue to raise money for the Inspire 343. Funds raised to date—\$52,800. Additional amount needed—\$11,900. These members would like to request that the congregation also consider donating to help raise the additional monies needed.

Everyone wants our money.

The Widows Offering – Luke 21: 1-4

King Frederick William III of Prussia

- The Bible also says a great deal about money.
- There are at least three life-lessons from the offering of the widow.
  - o Recognize that we own nothing we are stewards
  - o Manage life, money, and time for the purposes of God.
  - As sinners we are bankrupt faith in Christ ensures the treasure of heaven

Jesus looks up and sees the rich putting their gifts into the offering box, <sup>2</sup> and he sees a poor widow put in two small copper coins

- The temple treasury is called the chamber of secrets
- · Luke conceptually links the actions of the poor widow with a preceding warning against the greed of the scribes

The insignificant sum of two lepta given by the widow is more than all others

- The widow parts with everything the rich give out of excess
- Her "mite"—her willingness to offer God everything she had, was her "might"—the source of her strength and self-respect

What does the short story of the widow's mite teach us?

- First, God sees what man overlooks.
- Second, God evaluates our gifts
- Third, God commends a heart that gives in faith.

David Livingstone and Mary Moffat

Jesus knows all about sacrifice and pain - there is no fooling him

- Total sacrifice empties our purse into the collection plate when there is nothing in the bank
- Was it realistic for the widow to do that?

The widow gave with a generous heart in recognition of the treasure of heaven

- Disavowing any form of personal ownership places the faithful steward alongside the poor widow – under the word and will of God
- Bottom Line Psalm 24: The earth and all that fills it are the Lord's.
- The call of stewardship is not just a call on the wallet or purse.
- The widow empties them stewardship claims our whole life.
