Statement on Holy Communion/The Lord's Supper

The Lord's Supper is celebrated at this congregation in the confession and glad confidence that, as He says, our Lord gives into our mouths not only bread and wine but his very body and blood to eat and to drink for the forgiveness of sins and to strengthen our union with Him and with one another. Our Lord invites to His table those who trust His words, repent of all sin, and set aside any refusal to forgive and love as He forgives and loves us, that they may show forth His death until He comes.

Because those who eat and drink our Lord's body and blood unworthily do so to their great harm and because Holy Communion is a confession of the faith which is confessed at this altar, any who are not yet instructed, in doubt, or who hold a confession differing from that of this congregation and The Lutheran Church— Missouri Synod, and yet desire to receive the sacrament, are asked first to speak with the pastor or an usher.

For further study, see Matthew 5:23f.; 10:32f.; 18:15-35; 26:26-29; 1 Cor. 11:1734. Faith in Christ and His word is necessary for a blessed reception including Baptism in the name of the Trinity and faith in [1] Christ as Savior, [2] Jesus' clear words that the Sacrament is His body and blood, [3] the Lord's promise that in the Sacrament his or her sins are forgiven, and [4] receipt of the promised forgiveness reaffirmed and strengthened in his or her union with Christ and other Christians. The unbaptized and uninstructed person who does not yet know or believe in Christ and His promises is unprepared and should not commune. The unrepentant person who does not seek Christ's forgiveness for sins either general or particular—or refuses to forgive someone is unprepared and should not commune. The doubting person who denies or is unconvinced of what Jesus says of His bodily presence in the sacrament or its promised forgiveness is unprepared and should not commune.

Prayer Before Communion

Dear Savior, at Your gracious invitation I come to Your table to eat and drink Your holy body and blood. Let me find favor in Your eyes to receive this holy Sacrament in faith for the salvation of my soul and to the glory of Your holy name; for You live and reign with the Father and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.

Prayer After Communion

Almighty and everlasting God, I thank and praise You for feeding me the life-giving body and blood of Your beloved Son, Jesus Christ. Send Your Holy Spirit that, having with my mouth received the holy Sacrament, I may by faith obtain and eternally enjoy Your divine grace, the forgiveness of sins, unity with Christ, and life eternal; through Jesus Christ, my Lord. Amen.

As noted in the last call process update, in early November, the Southeast District (SED) President provided GLCS with a list of pastors for consider-**COMMITTEE** ation as our next senior pastor. The call committee reviewed the list of pastors, held phone conversations (via video-tele-conference (VTC)) with several pastors, and have invited a few pastors to visit GLCS in January. At this stage in the call process, we do not share the names of the pastors the call committee is considering; we are mindful the pastors may not have

told their congregations they are open to considering a call.

As we look ahead, it's possible we may have a Call Service in late February or March. The Board of Servant Leaders will announce the Call Service (which is also a Voters Meeting). Prior to the Call Service, there will be Town Hall Meetings where the congregation will be provided additional information on the call process and the pastors.

The Radical Contrasts of Kings: Jesus and the House of Herod [Matthew 2: 13-23]

Herod is not a genuine king

<u>Matthew is busy with OT citations:</u> Hosea 11:1, Jeremiah 31:15, and multiple allusions to the despised Messiah

Jesus: Taxonomy of Moses or more properly Moses: Taxonomy of Jesus

• The ministry of Jesus is a new exodus with Jesus as Israel - the new Son of God

Out of Egypt I called my son is a direct citation of Hosea 11:1

- The first exodus redeems Israel from slavery and bondage in Egypt
- The second exodus through the greater and perfect son redeems us from slavery and bondage to our sin

Jesus is Israel - he is the promised Son of God

We cannot help but read the OT as types of NT realities

- The OT records real events
- OT history reflects NT realities in specific situational detail, amplified escalation and climax

The OT types help us comprehend Matthew 2: 24 -15

• Jesus is the son that comes out of Egypt and saves His people from their sin

Where is the slaughter of innocent children by Herod pictured in the OT?

 Jeremiah 31: 15 - Thus, says the LORD: A voice is heard in Ramah, lamentation and bitter weeping. Rachel is weeping for her children; she refuses to be comforted for her children, because they are no more."

Why do we regard the Holy Innocents of Bethlehem as martyrs?

- They die for the sake of Christ
- Hence; we celebrate Holy Innocent's Day every December 28

Joseph is again warned in a dream about the violent son of Herod taking up where his father left off in Judea

- Joseph leaves Galilee for Nazareth
- Our Lord is called a Nazarene and receives the contempt due a person of Nazareth

Can you imagine how confused Joseph and Mary must have been – yet remain faithful and obedient to God?

<u>APPLICATION: It is better to suffer all things for the Gospel – God works for our good [2 Corinthians 4]</u> What Jesus, Joseph and Mary know, trust, and live are the promises of God and God has a plan for me and you

- An OT plan a NT plan a perfect plan for a perfect Son and our redemption
- We do not always know where God is leading us but we can be certain that He is with us and His plans are for our good

Help For Your Food Budget

SHARE, a non-profit, community-based organization, provides healthy and nutritious groceries at an almost 50% discount. This is ac-



complished through high-volume purchasing and thousands of volunteer hours.

Monthly packages cost \$23 and include \$40-\$50 worth of basic and healthy groceries, typically made up of 4-6 lbs of frozen protein and 8-12 lbs fresh fruits and vegetables, sometimes with seasonal grocery or dessert items. "Specials" are also available each month.
