Statement on Holy Communion/The Lord's Supper

The Lord's Supper is celebrated at this congregation in the confession and glad confidence that, as He says, our Lord gives into our mouths not only bread and wine but his very body and blood to eat and to drink for the forgiveness of sins and to strengthen our union with Him and with one another. Our Lord invites to His table those who trust His words, repent of all sin, and set aside any refusal to forgive and love as He forgives and loves us, that they may show forth His death until He comes.

Because those who eat and drink our Lord's body and blood unworthily do so to their great harm and because Holy Communion is a confession of the faith which is confessed at this altar, any who are not yet instructed, in doubt, or who hold a confession differing from that of this congregation and The Lutheran Church— Missouri Synod, and yet desire to receive the sacrament, are asked first to speak with the pastor or an usher.

For further study, see Matthew 5:23f.; 10:32f.; 18:15-35; 26:26-29; 1 Cor. 11:1734. Faith in Christ and His word is necessary for a blessed reception including Baptism in the name of the Trinity and faith in [1] Christ as Savior, [2] Jesus' clear words that the Sacrament is His body and blood, [3] the Lord's promise that in the Sacrament his or her sins are forgiven, and [4] receipt of the promised forgiveness reaffirmed and strengthened in his or her union with Christ and other Christians. The unbaptized and uninstructed person who does not yet know or believe in Christ and His promises is unprepared and should not commune. The unrepentant person who does not seek Christ's forgiveness for sins either general or particular—or refuses to forgive someone is unprepared and should not commune. The doubting person who denies or is unconvinced of what Jesus says of His bodily presence in the sacrament or its promised forgiveness is unprepared and should not commune.

Prayer Before Communion

Dear Savior, at Your gracious invitation I come to Your table to eat and drink Your holy body and blood. Let me find favor in Your eyes to receive this holy Sacrament in faith for the salvation of my soul and to the glory of Your holy name; for You live and reign with the Father and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.

Prayer After Communion

Almighty and everlasting God, I thank and praise You for feeding me the life-giving body and blood of Your beloved Son, Jesus Christ. Send Your Holy Spirit that, having with my mouth received the holy Sacrament, I may by faith obtain and eternally enjoy Your divine grace, the forgiveness of sins, unity with Christ, and life eternal; through Jesus Christ, my Lord. Amen.

As noted in the last call process update, in early November, the Southeast District (SED) President provided GLCS with a list of pastors for consider-**COMMITTEE** ation as our next senior pastor. SHARE, a non-profit, community-based organization, provides healthy and nutritious groceries at an almost 50% discount. This is



accomplished through high-volume purchasing and thousands of volunteer hours.

Monthly packages cost \$23 and include \$40-\$50 worth of basic and healthy groceries, typically made up of 4-6 lbs of frozen protein and 8-12 lbs fresh fruits and vegetables, sometimes with seasonal grocery or dessert items. "Specials" are also available each month.


said, was one great offering to the Father in our stead to fulfill all righteousness for us. All our offerings back to our Lord are in thanksgiving for this one great, true offering.

Stewardship 2020

You may have heard that the love of money is the root of all evil. It is a misquote. I Timothy 6:10 reads: *For the love of money is a root of all kinds of evil*. The operative word in the quote is love. As the verse continues - those transfixed by money, possessions, and mammon wander from the faith and sow sorrow and grief.

Our checkbook, debit card, and credit statements mirror our values and interest in this life. Expenses expose our intentional values. The Scriptures seem very clear here – our faith values ought to be the root of our budgets. Our first fruit expenses ought to be for the Gospel and compassion of Christ. Take a moment to think through your blessings in Christ this New Year with an eye to your past and future intentional giving to Jesus and his work of redemption. Consider reworking your monthly expenses in terms of intention and sanctified faith to better reflect you as a new creation in Christ. Know that the Lord Himself is God. It is He *who has made us and not we ourselves* [Psalm 100:3]. To paraphrase Jesus in Matthew 6: beware of practicing your righteousness – instead praise God first with your giving especially to the poor and needy in the church.

You see, the Bible teaches that Christian giving is an act of worship. In 1 Corinthians 16: 2, Paul says, *On the first day of the week, each one of you is to put aside and save*. Why put our offerings aside, and save on the first day of the week: because Paul knows that on the first day of the week we are going together to worship God. Very often we debate whether tithing is the standard for giving. But the Apostle Paul scuttles that whole discussion. *For you know the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, that though He was rich, yet for your sake He became poor, so that you through His poverty might become rich*. Paul is saying, now look; as you think about giving to those in need, keep in mind that Jesus came from glory and heaven's high halls and gave it all up so that you might know the wealth and security of heaven's high halls. In other words, He emptied Himself of His privileges that you might enjoy those privileges - give in this light!

Here's another principle. The Bible teaches that Christian giving should be done in accordance with our means. Sometimes you've see televangelists say things like, get that credit card out and make a pledge in faith that God's going to give that money to you. Well, compare what Paul says in 2 Corinthians 8:12: For if the readiness is present. it is acceptable according to what a person has, not according to what he does not have. That means two things. First of all, it means that our giving is to be proportionate to our means. Secondly, however, it means that the Lord never asks us to give what we don't have – he is not a proponent of unmanageable debt.

Finally, consider 2 Corinthians 9:7. The Bible also teaches that our giving is to be unconstrained, willing giving. *Each one must do just as he has purposed in his heart, not grudgingly or under compulsion*. Yes, Christian giving is a requirement; obligation; and responsibility; but it is also voluntary sacrificial prayer, praise, and thanksgiving. And here Paul enjoins: Don't do this because somebody's standing over you with a whiplash. Do this because your heart desires to do that which is pleasing to God – *for God loves a cheerful giver*.

May the glory of God be your first priority in everything this New Year 2020. The eye of God is on the sparrow – it is also on you and me when it comes to stewardship.

Baptism – From Lost to Found [Baptism of Our Lord Matthew 3: 13-17]

Jesus appears at the Jordan River for baptism standing with sinners

- God the Father adjudicates the baptism of Jesus [Epiphany]
- The vicarious nature of the baptism of Jesus is explicitly stated by Saint Paul in our Epistle Lesson we are joined to the death and resurrection of Jesus in Holy Baptism
- Saint Paul also identifies baptism as the circumcision of Christ in Colossians 2: 11-12
- Luther and the medieval church call baptism christening

Circumcision provides a profound theological insight into the very essence of baptism

- Abram gets a new name Abraham
- He receives a visible sign of God's promise to send a Savior born of woman

We are baptized by God in his name where God stakes his honor, power, and might on baptism

Have you made a decision for Christ? But is this what the Bible teaches? Can the unbeliever make a decision for Christ?

- You did not choose Me, but I chose and appointed you [John 15:16]
- We are according to Saint Paul dead in our sins
- A dead person in not capable of choosing or deciding anything

If you wish to choose: is baptism our promise from God or our promise to God?

- When Peter preaches at Pentecost the people are cut to the heart and ask brothers what shall we do?
- Peter does not direct them to an altar call
- He says: repent and be baptized for the forgiveness of your sins, and you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. ³⁹ For the promise is for you and for your children

We speak with admiration about inherited physical traits - thank God such fondness does not extend to our inherited sinful nature

All people regardless of age receive the kingdom of heaven the same way: *born of water and the Spirit*

We close with two familiar sayings; first - show me your friends and I will show you your future

• In baptism - what a friend we have in Jesus

Show me your clothes and I will show you who you are – when *baptized into Christ we put on Christ* as our garment of salvation

- Scripture comes full circle in baptism we receive the promise given to Abraham
- We are clothed and joined to Christ who is Abraham's singular seed
- We are born as the collective seed of Abraham heirs of righteousness and citizens of heaven it truly is *christening*
