Statement on Holy Communion/The Lord's Supper

The Lord's Supper is celebrated at this congregation in the confession and glad confidence that, as He says, our Lord gives into our mouths not only bread and wine but his very body and blood to eat and to drink for the forgiveness of sins and to strengthen our union with Him and with one another. Our Lord invites to His table those who trust His words, repent of all sin, and set aside any refusal to forgive and love as He forgives and loves us, that they may show forth His death until He comes.

Because those who eat and drink our Lord's body and blood unworthily do so to their great harm and because Holy Communion is a confession of the faith which is confessed at this altar, any who are not yet instructed, in doubt, or who hold a confession differing from that of this congregation and The Lutheran Church— Missouri Synod, and yet desire to receive the sacrament, are asked first to speak with the pastor or an usher.

For further study, see Matthew 5:23f.; 10:32f.; 18:15-35; 26:26-29; 1 Cor. 11:1734. Faith in Christ and His word is necessary for a blessed reception including Baptism in the name of the Trinity and faith in [1] Christ as Savior, [2] Jesus' clear words that the Sacrament is His body and blood, [3] the Lord's promise that in the Sacrament his or her sins are forgiven, and [4] receipt of the promised forgiveness reaffirmed and strengthened in his or her union with Christ and other Christians. The unbaptized and uninstructed person who does not yet know or believe in Christ and His promises is unprepared and should not commune. The unrepentant person who does not seek Christ's forgiveness for sins—either general or particular—or refuses to forgive someone is unprepared and should not commune. The doubting person who denies or is unconvinced of what Jesus says of His bodily presence in the sacrament or its promised forgiveness is unprepared and should not commune.

Prayer Before Communion

Dear Savior, at Your gracious invitation I come to Your table to eat and drink Your holy body and blood. Let me find favor in Your eyes to receive this holy Sacrament in faith for the salvation of my soul and to the glory of Your holy name; for You live and reign with the Father and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.

Prayer After Communion

Almighty and everlasting God, I thank and praise You for feeding me the life-giving body and blood of Your beloved Son, Jesus Christ. Send Your Holy Spirit that, having with my mouth received the holy Sacrament, I may by faith obtain and eternally enjoy Your divine grace, the forgiveness of sins, unity with Christ, and life eternal; through Jesus Christ, my Lord. Amen.



As noted in the last call process update, in early November, the Southeast District (SED) President provided GLCS with a list of pastors for consider-**COMMITTEE** ation as our next senior pastor. The call committee reviewed the list of pastors, held phone conversations (via video-tele-conference (VTC)) with several pastors, and have invited a few pastors to visit GLCS in January. At this stage in the call process, we do not share the names of the pastors the call committee is considering; we are mindful the pastors may not have

told their congregations they are open to considering a call.

As we look ahead, it's possible we may have a Call Service in late February or March. The Board of Servant Leaders will announce the Call Service (which is also a Voters Meeting). Prior to the Call Service, there will be Town Hall Meetings where the congregation will be provided additional information on the call process and the pastors.

A small book: Preparing to Receive Holy Communion has been placed in the pews of the sanctuary and on the table of the Family Life Cen-



The Lamb of God Calls the First Disciples [John 1:29–42a]

Identity crisis: not so for John the Baptist and Jesus

- I am the voice of one crying out in the wilderness
- Behold, the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world!

The OT prophet John uses a double OT allusion to the identity of Jesus

 Passover Lamb of God of Exodus 12 and scapegoat of Leviticus 16 that takes away the sin of the world

As the Lamb of God Jesus says to every one of us – you are no longer a sinner

 2 Corinthians 5:21 - ²¹ For our sake he made him to be sin who knew no sin, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God

John the Baptist makes hay with the well-known slogan of the Lutheran Hour – We Preach Christ Crucified

TEXT TRANSITION: John exits - Jesus takes center stage

- Andrew and John hear the words: Behold, the Lamb of God and follow Jesus
- In fact, they must catch up to Jesus who guestions them: What do you want?

<u>Evangelism 101</u>: The first thing Andrew does after spending a day with Jesus is find his brother Simon and say: We have found the Messiah (which means Christ)

 We know little about Andrew other than he is the first called disciple yet his trademark is bringing people to Jesus

[MBWA] - Jesus meets people in their vocations and the vagaries of life

- D.L. Moody on evangelism
- Lord Protector Oliver Cromwell allegory about doing evangelism
- Cromwell's point is driven home at Messiah Lutheran a short lived church planting in Waldorf

If Saint Andrew came to an evangelism meeting – he would say let the conversation begin

- Andrew is not put off by the nones he remains committed to five simple words
- The more people think about and engage faith practices the more they talk about it

CS Lewis pegged our digital culture in 1946

- Science explains life while busyness work, entertainment, always-on technology fills up life
- Saint Andrew Snapchat power user!

As shown by Saint Andrew – the majority of faith conversations that lead to transformative life change happen face to face with a close friend or family member

- Stay with Jesus and tell others you have found him Jesus will do the rest
- John 14:6 Jesus is the way, and the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through him [You can say this to others]
